

Step-By-Step Guide to Using Repour in a BTG Program

Repour should be considered a “close-of-service” procedure. At the end of service/end of day, a new Repour stopper should be placed on every open bottle of wine (if it doesn’t have one in it already).

1 DURING SERVICE

During service, open bottles of wine as needed. These newly-opened bottles should be re-closed with their original cork or screwcap until the end of service.

2 REPOUR IN A BOTTLE FROM A PREVIOUS DAY

If a bottle has a Repour in it from a previous day, that Repour should stay with the bottle until it is empty.

To use it:

1. Remove Repour.
2. Pour a glass or glasses.
3. Re-insert Repour.
(Activated Repours should always be left in a bottle – not on a shelf or counter.)
4. Repeat until the bottle is empty.
5. When the bottle is empty, dispose of the bottle and Repour.

3 AT THE CLOSE OF SERVICE

For bottles without Repour on them:

1. Remove the foil tab from the bottom of Repour.
2. Place Repour firmly in the bottle.
3. Store bottles upright until the next day. (Bottles with Repour in them can be refrigerated.)

For bottles with Repour already on them:

Store bottles upright until you’re ready to pour the next glass.
